Iconic Buildings, LLC desires to submit and MDEQ accepts the site for participation in the Brownfields Voluntary Cleanup and Redevelopment Program.
2	In Sync Holdings, LLC New Orleans, LA Pascagoula Ice and Freezer Company, Inc. Jackson Co., MS	Order No. 7229 22	Respondent has an interest in a tract of land located in Pascagoula, MS. The site is contaminated with petroleum hydrocarbons in the soils and ammonia in groundwater at levels in excess of the Target Remediation Goals (TRG's); and therefore, remediation of the Brownfield Agreement Site is necessary.
3	Larry White Jasper Co., MS	Order No. 7230 22 Respondent is ordered to conduct cleanup of the waste tire dump locations identified in the Order, ensure proper transportation of collected tires to an authorized waste tire management facility, and conduct recordkeeping and reporting requirements all as outlined in Sections 12.A. through 12.D. of the Order; Respondent shall complete cleanup activities within 45 days of the Order and complete reporting requirements within 60 days of the Order.
